 - Improve existing pacing guides and create pacing guides for curriculum where pacing guides don't exist (in process).
 - Make sure all families are provided with pacing guides for all of their curriculum (Begin to develop a readily-available list of useful resources and curriculum recommendations for staff to use for specific areas (example Read Naturally; AAR; IXL; Math-U-See).
 - Develop a Student Support Team (SST) to help identify and support struggling students.
